Day 1: DAY 1: BELGRADE

Welcome to **Belgrade**! We'll **transfer** you to the hotel, and you'll have some **free time**. In the afternoon, you'll find information about the start of your tour on the boards located at the hotel reception.

Day 2: DAY 2: BELGRADE

In the lively capital of Serbia, situated at the confluence of the Danube and the Sava, we'll enjoy a **panoramic city tour** and explore the bustling city center, see the parliament, and stroll through Kalemegdan Fortress.



(The Museum of Yugoslavia in Belgrade showcases modernist Yugoslav architecture and preserves the region's cultural and historical heritage.)

The tour also includes a visit to the **Museum of Yugoslavia**, where Tito's Mausoleum is located. In the afternoon, you'll have free time to explore the city at your leisure.

Day 3: DAY 3: BELGRADE - SREMSKA MITROVICA - REPUBLIC OF SRPSKA - SARAJEVO

We begin our beautiful journey traveling toward the region of Vojvodina. We stop in **SREMSKA MITROVICA**, a city with a charming historic center on the banks of the Sava River, once one of the most important cities of the Roman Empire and the capital of the province of Pannonia.



(The charming city center of Sremska Mitrovica blends historic Serbian architecture with vibrant local culture and lively pedestrian streets.)

Entrance to the Imperial Palace of Sirmium is included, giving us insight into this period. We then continue toward Bosnia, stopping en route for lunch. Our journey takes us across the Republic of Srpska—the Serbian Republic of Bosnia—through beautiful landscapes to **SARAJEVO**. Arrival in the late afternoon and time to explore the historic center, where you can stroll through the enchanting bazaar, the old Ottoman market famous for its architecture, oriental atmosphere, and traditional shops. Dinner included.

Day 4: DAY 4: SARAJEVO - MOSTAR - HERZEGOVINA - DUBROVNIK

In the morning, we include a guided tour of **SARAJEVO**, a fascinating city known as the "Jerusalem of Europe" for its coexistence of different religions. Mosques, churches, and synagogues reflect this rich diversity. We will notice the strong Ottoman influence in its old town, with its more than 500-year-old mosque and beautiful fountain.

After the visit, we continue our journey through an area of stunning natural beauty to **MOSTAR**, with its beautiful historic center and its iconic stone bridge that links the Orthodox, Muslim, and Catholic communities. Free time for lunch and to explore the city.

We then continue to **CROATIA**. Border formalities (which may be lengthy). Arrival in **DUBROVNIK** at the end of the day. Dinner included

Day 5: DAY 5: DUBROVNIK

We'll enjoy a **panoramic tour of Dubrovnik** with a local guide in the morning. We will undoubtedly be in one of the most beautiful cities in Europe, perched on a cliff, surrounded by walls, and kissed by the Adriatic Sea. Its intact historic center is a jewel of world architectural heritage. We'll have the opportunity to enjoy a stunning view of the city from a scenic viewpoint along the road. The tour includes tickets to the **Franciscan Monastery**, home to the oldest pharmacy in Europe, and the Assumption Cathedral. We'll also take a **boat trip to Lokrum**, a small island just 15 minutes away that is home to the ruins of an eleventh-century Benedictine monastery, a popular setting for the series *Game of Thrones*.



(Enjoy a scenic boat trip to Lokrum Island, one of Dubrovnik's most beautiful natural escapes on the Adriatic Sea.)

Afterward, you'll have **free time to explore at your leisure** before returning to the hotel in the late afternoon. **Dinner will be included.**

Note: On some occasions, accommodation may be in Cavtat, a coastal town near Dubrovnik. From November to March, there is no boat service to Lokrum, so we will not visit the island during these months.

Day 6: DAY 6: DUBROVNIK - STON - SPLIT

We'll set off in the morning, traveling along the stunning Croatian coastline, which features breathtaking seascapes and islands. Our first stop will be in **Ston**, a picturesque town boasting one of the longest walls in the world. As we continue through beautiful landscapes, we'll cross the impressive Pelješac Bridge over the sea.

We'll arrive in **Split** at midday and enjoy a **tour with a local guide**, including **admission to Diocletian's Palace**. We'll explore this vast Roman palace, with its labyrinthine streets and stunning sea views. **Dinner will be included**.

Day 7: DAY 7: SPLIT - BRAC ISLAND - BOL ISLAND

From **SPLIT**, we **board a ferry** to the **ISLAND OF BRAČ**, one of the most beautiful islands in the Adriatic, surrounded by deep blue seascapes and rugged coastlines. We travel through the island's interior, passing olive groves and stone walls, to Donji Humac, where we **visit the Jakšić Gallery (entrance included)**, a reflection of the local sculptural tradition.

We enjoy a **traditional Croatian brunch (included)** at a typical konoba, then continue **up to Vidova Gora**, the highest point of the Adriatic islands, offering unforgettable views of the Dalmatian Coast and the famous Zlatni Rat beach. The day ends in Bol, a charming seaside town, with free time to stroll along the waterfront or relax on its crystal-clear beaches.

Day 8: DAY 8: BOL ISLAND - HVAR ISLAND - JELSA

The day begins in **BOL**, with free time to enjoy the Adriatic Sea and relax on the famous Zlatni Rat beach, known for its crystal-clear waters. A unique natural setting to enjoy the island's charm at a leisurely pace.

In the afternoon, **we board a catamaran to HVAR ISLAND**, sailing through turquoise waters and past small islands. Arrival in **JELSA**, a quiet harbor with a Mediterranean feel. **Transfer to the hotel** and overnight stay.

Day 9: DAY 9: JELSA - KORCULA ISLAND - KORCULA ISLAND

Free morning in **HVAR** to stroll through one of the Adriatic's most exclusive destinations, renowned for its elegant Venetian architecture, white stone alleyways, and lively Mediterranean atmosphere.



(Explore the timeless beauty of Korčula Island, known for its medieval architecture, coastal scenery, and rich Croatian heritage.)

In the afternoon, **we take a ferry to KORCULA ISLAND**, sailing through a seascape dotted with small islands and deep blue waters. Arrival in Korčula, a walled town with a strong medieval character and renowned as the birthplace of Marco Polo. **Transfer to the hotel, then free time to explore and take in** its vibrant atmosphere and stunning views over the Adriatic.

Day 10: DAY 10: KORCULA ISLAND - PELJESAC PENINSULA - DUBROVNIK

In the morning, we discover **KORCULA** on a complete **guided tour**, exploring its walled old town, full of history and medieval charm. We then cross over to the **PELJESAC** Peninsula, a land of vineyards with a long winemaking tradition, where we **enjoy a wine tasting (included)** in an exceptional rural **scenery**.



(The Pelješac Peninsula is famous for its rolling vineyards, crystal-clear coastline, and authentic Dalmatian charm.)

We continue to **DUBROVNIK**, the Pearl of the Adriatic. Arrival at around 3:00 PM, followed by free time to begin enjoying its unique atmosphere, stroll along its city walls, or wander through the streets of its impressive historic old town. Overnight stay.

Day 11: DAY 11: DUBROVNIK

After breakfast, our journey will come to an end, leaving you with wonderful lasting memories.
